

SICS Travel Grant

This year there are two grants on offer, each has a value of up to £2000, awarded in whole or part. The purpose of the grant is to support travel to study or experience critical care in an environment/location different from the individual's normal workplace. The grant is accessible to all SICS members of any profession and any grade. Joining the Society at the time of application is acceptable.

To apply send a clear summary (maximum length - one side of A4 only in 12 point font as a Word document) of your proposed project, anticipated costs and benefits accruing from the trip to the Secretary at the address below or by email. Any other sources of funding or applications for funding must be declared and a letter of support from the institution to be visited is desirable. The marking scheme used by the SICS Council to assess travel grant applications is given on the following page.

The successful applicant(s) must present an account of their project(s) at the following years' SICS Annual Scientific Meeting in January.

The closing date this year will be 5pm, Friday 1st April 2016. Applications will be considered at the SICS Council meeting in the spring. The decision of the Council is final.
