This one-day course, which is suitable for FY2, Year 1/2 ACCS and CT 1/2 trainees in acute specialties, ACCPs and experienced ICU or HDU nurses, has been designed to help you to recognise, assess and manage acutely ill adults who require critical care.

Topics covered in the course include:

- Assessment and initial management of the critically ill adult
 - Emergency airway management
 - Respiratory failure and mechanical ventilation
 - Shock, invasive monitoring and circulatory support
 - Acute brain injury
 - Severe sepsis and septic shock
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- Clinical human factors
 - Team working and communication
 - Clinical decision making
 - Critical events in the ventilated patient

Maximum 8 participants per course.
